Notice of Proposed Decision

The Colorado Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety has issued a proposed decision to Approve Bond Release Application No. 15 (SL-15) for the Trapper Mine, Permit No. C-1981-010. The Surface operation is operated by Trapper Mining, Inc. under the provisions of the Colorado Surface Coal Mining Reclamation Act of 1979. The bond release application was submitted by Trapper Mining, Inc. on September 30, 2013. Trapper Mining, Inc. submitted a partial Phase I bond release request application for 120.4 acres. The affected area is located in Moffat County, approximately 6 miles Southwest of Craig, Colorado.
