Re: Henderson Development, Permit No. M-1980-110 (Sandy Acres Pit) Second round of adequacy comments regarding Technical Revision Application No. TR-02 (TR-02)

Mr. Thomson:

On January 22, 2014, DRMS received your responses to our first adequacy letter dated January 2, 2014. The responses were adequate for our comments numbered 2 through 9.

The response to comment 1 was inadequate. Comment 1 raised the question of whether the proposed work requires a Technical Revision or an Amendment. The proposed work is the installation of a box culvert underneath Nome Street where a conveyor will be placed for transporting backfill material from the 29 Pit, west of the street, to the Sandy Acres Pit, east of the street. This work will involve disturbing ground outside the existing permit area for the purpose of conducting reclamation inside the existing permit area. This new disturbance will be an expansion of the mine's affected area; therefore, the proposed work requires a permit Amendment. "Amendment" means a change in the permit or an application which increases the acreage of the affected land, or which has a significant effect upon the approved or proposed Reclamation Plan (Rule 1.1(6)).

Please submit the proposed work as an application for an Amendment. If we do not receive a request for withdrawal of the application for TR-02 by February 10, 2014, then TR-02 will be denied.
