The Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety (Division) received Technical Revision – 4 (TR-04) for the above referenced site on February 3, 2014. The decision date for this application is March 5, 2014. The Division has reviewed the TR-04 proposal and has the following comments.

1. Please provide an explanation of why the permit boundaries need to be redefined. Typically any change to the permit boundary will require approval of an acreage reduction or an amendment application. In addition, you must provide a map showing the proposed changes to the permit boundary.

Please see revised map, and dialogue sent in my previous correspondence.

2. Please indicate if the rotomillings and crushed concrete will be processed onsite.

Rotomillings and crushed concrete will be processed at the county shop location, and brought to the pit site. No processing shall take place within the pit.

3. Please specify the approximate volume of material that will be stockpiled at the site and specify where the stockpiles will be located.

The maximum amount will be 600 cubic yards. The location is indicated on the revised map.

This concludes the Division's preliminary adequacy review of this application. Please remember that the decision date for this application is March 5, 2014. If you are unable to provide satisfactory responses to any inadequacies prior to this date, it will be your responsibility to request an extension of time to allow for continued review of this application. If there are still unresolved issues when the decision date arrives and no extension has been requested, the application will be denied.
