

Expand Pond D, Relocate E & W Diversion Ditches

Dear Sir or Madam:



Bowie Resources, LLC (BRL) is proposing to expand Pond D, and relocate the diversion ditches upgradient of Gob Pile #2 in advance of a request to expand Gob Pile #2. The proposed expansion of Pond D would result in the removal and destruction of the Coal Sales house associated with the historic King Mine. Five acres of additional disturbance and a reclamation performance bond increase are proposed.

The Underground coal mining operation is on land located approximately 5 miles Northeast of Paonia, Colorado. The permit area is further described as follows:

Portions of Sections 2, 3, 4, 5, 8, 9, 10, 11, 14, 15, 16, and 22, Township 13 South, Range 91 West of the 6th P.M. Portions of Sections 33 and 34, Township 12 South, Range 91 West of the 6th P.M.

The above-mentioned tracts of land are shown on the following USGS 7.5 minute Quadrangle map(s): Bowie.

Because the above referenced technical revision application would incorporate additional lands into the permit area or might otherwise alter previously approved permit conditions or mitigation measures, the Division is coordinating with the Office of Surface Mining on evaluation of the potential for impacts to threatened or endangered species of plants or animals, or wildlife species

A copy of the permit section addressing potential effects of the operation to threatened and endangered (T&E) species has been forwarded to the Office of Surface Mining. The OSM will prepare the biological assessment necessary for approval based on the information provided in the application, and OSM will coordinate with your office as necessary. This coordination is required to ensure mitigation of potential impacts to federally protected wildlife species.

The applicant is required to publish notice in the *Delta County Independent* that this application has been deemed complete. At the time of publication of this notice, the applicant is additionally required to place a copy of this application at the Paonia Public Library, P.O. Box 969, Paonia, , and at the Division office. In order for us to comply with regulatory time frames, we request that comments be submitted within ten (10) days of this letter.
