OBSERVATIONS

This inspection occurred in response to a request from Mike Thompson, Reardon Steel, on behalf of a local contractor, Phil Blackford. As reported by Thompson, Mr. Blackford had commenced an excavation at or nearby Ouray and had approached Mr. Thompson with an inquiry as to the need for a reclamation permit.

Mr. Thompson and Mr. Blackford accompanied the Division to the extraction site. The excavation activity had occurred within the permit boundary of the Memphis Site and had advanced a previous excavation conducted under the permit. Mr. Blackford stated the material extraction had been authorized by the landowner, reported to be Rick Wilson. The recent excavation activity appeared to have been conducted in an orderly manner, typical of an experienced and professional contractor, and appeared to be compliant with the conditions of the permit and the applicable requirements of the Act and Rules. Affected lands appeared well maintained and stable; evidence of slumping, settling or erosion was not observed.

Mr. Blackford inquired about the conditions of the permit and specifically the boundaries of the permit. The day after the inspection, on April 3, 2014, the Division forwarded a copy of a portion of Exhibit E (map) to Mr. Thompson, illustrating the permit boundary. A copy of the map portion provided to Mr. Thompson is enclosed with this report.

The recent activity at the Memphis Site secures the permit status as Active. As such, the Permittee is not required at this time to revise the permit status from Active to Temporary Cessation, pursuant to Rule 1.13. The Permittee is encouraged to record the dates and provide a brief description of the recent material extraction on the next annual report, due February 2, 2015, as evidence of Active status.

Therefore, the material extraction site inspected on April 2, 2014, was located entirely within an area permitted for such activity and the Division at this time has no reason to believe a violation of the permit conditions, or the Act and Rules, has occurred. The Division considers this investigation to be closed.
