## **OBSERVATIONS**

This inspection was conducted as part of the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety's (Division) normal monitoring program. Tony Appelhanz, representing the Operator, was present during this inspection. Photographs are included with this report in order to illustrate some of the conditions observed.

The Base Products Gravel Pit #1 site is located approximately four miles northwest of Montrose and accessed from 6175 Road. The site is a 112c operation that includes a total of 55.44 permitted acres. The Division currently holds a financial warranty amount of \$32,303.00 for this site. The Division has reviewed the reclamation costs, in order to ensure the financial warranty reflects the actual current cost of fulfilling the requirements of the Reclamation Plan, and determined that the current financial warranty amount is sufficient.

Adequate mine identification signage was noted at the entrance to the site.

The affected area was marked by fencing and posts that were clearly visible and adequate to delineate the affected area boundary.

The site is active. The operator reports that several truck loads of material are removed from the site per week. Materials stockpiles are located throughout the pit floor area. Topsoil is stockpiled near the west permit boundary.

Slopes in the south part of the permit area have been graded at 3H:1V, with vegetation establishing on the slopes.

No problems or violations were noted during this inspection.
