OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted as part of the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety's (Division) normal monitoring program. Theresa Kane, representing the Operator, was present during this inspection. Photographs are included with this report in order to illustrate some of the conditions observed.

The King Mountain Sand and Gravel Mine is located approximately five miles west of Toponas and accessed from CR3. The site is a 112c operation that includes a total of 341 permitted acres. The Division currently holds a financial warranty amount of \$231,300.00 for this site. The Division has reviewed the reclamation costs, based on the observed disturbance, and determined that the current financial warranty amount is adequate.

Adequate mine identification signage was noted at the entrance to the site.

The affected area was marked by fencing and posts that were clearly visible and adequate to delineate the affected area boundary.

Mining at the site is still contained within the original 110c permit area. Approximately 8-9 acres are disturbed. The pit is approximately 30-40 feet deep. Pit slopes are graded to approximately 2-3H:1V. Topsoil is stockpiled in a berm along the west pit rim. Various materials stockpiles were located on the pit floor. Equipment is stored on the bench on the east side of the pit. No equipment was located within the pit. Standing water observed in the low area of the pit appeared to be from recent snowmelt. No seeps were noted in any pit walls. The site appears to be well maintained.

No problems or violations were noted during this inspection.


