Changes to pond and ditch designs, the surface water monitoring plan, pit limits and ARR due date

Dear Ms. Kieler:

The Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety hereby issues notice, in accordance with Title 34, Article 33, Section 116, Paragraph 4, of the Colorado Revised Statutes, that on May 19, 2014 an application to revise coal mining operations at the New Horizon North Mine was considered complete for the purposes of filing. The revision was submitted by Western Fuels-Colorado, LLC. All review and comment periods as provided in the Act and the Regulations initiate from this date of filing.

TR-6 proposes changes to: the design of Pond NHN-002 and associated ditches, the surface water monitoring plan, pit limits, and the due date for Annual Reclamation Reports. The applicant is proposing additional surface disturbance outside of the area currently approved for disturbance.

The surface coal mining operation is on land located approximately 2.5 miles Northwest of Nucla. The permit area is further described as follows:

Portions of Sections 25 and 36, T 47 N, R 16 W, N.M.P.M.

The above-mentioned tracts of land are shown on the following USGS 7.5 minute Quadrangle map(s): Nucla.



The applicant is required to publish notice in a local newspaper that this application has been deemed complete. At the time of publication of this notice, the applicant is additionally required to place a copy of this application at the Montrose County Courthouse, 300 Main Street, Nucla, CO 81424, and at the Division office. In order for us to comply with regulatory time frames, we request that comments be submitted within fifteen (15) days of this letter. If no comments are received by then, we will proceed on the assumption that you have no concerns with, or objections to, the applicant's proposal.
