This Revision will amend TR66 for the design of the RDA haul road.

Dear Mr. Prenzlow:

The Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety hereby issues notice, in accordance with Title 34, Article 33, Section 116, Paragraph 4, of the Colorado Revised Statutes, that on May 30, 2014 an application to revise coal mining operations at the New Elk Mine was considered complete for the purposes of filing. The revision was submitted by New Elk Coal Company, LLC. All review and comment periods as provided in the Act and the Regulations initiate from this date of filing.

The applicant is not proposing additional surface disturbance outside of the area currently approved for disturbance.

The underground coal mining operation is on land located approximately 25 miles West of Trinidad, Colorado. The permit area is further described as follows:

T33S, R68W, Portions of Sections 24, 25 and 26 All sections are partially or fully projected by New Elk Coal Company due to the unsurveyed nature of the Maxwell Land Grant. The abovementioned tracts of land are shown on the USGS 7.5 minute Quadrangle maps of Vigil, Tercio, and Stonewall.

The above-mentioned tracts of land are shown on the following USGS 7.5 minute Quadrangle map(s): Vigil.



Because the above referenced technical revision application would incorporate additional lands into the permit area or might otherwise alter previously approved permit conditions or mitigation measures, we are requesting your agency's evaluation of the proposal. Your comments and concerns relating to the adequacy of fish and wildlife resources information, the fish and wildlife plan, and the reclamation plan as it relates to fish and wildlife considerations, including potential impacts to threatened or endangered species, are requested. If wildlife habitat is the proposed postmining land use, we request your evaluation of proposed woody plant stocking levels, planting arrangements, and methods for mitigation of potential adverse impacts.

The applicant is required to publish notice in a local newspaper that this application has been deemed complete. At the time of publication of this notice, the applicant is additionally required to place a copy of this application at the Las Animas County Clerk and Recorder, 200 East First Street, Room 205, Trinidad, CO 81082, and at the Division office. In order for us to comply with regulatory time frames, we request that comments be submitted within fifteen (15) days of this letter. If no comments are received by then, we will proceed on the assumption that you have no concerns with, or objections to, the applicant's proposal.
