OBSERVATIONS

This was a pre-operation inspection conducted by the Division as part of its monitoring of mineral prospecting projects. On the day of the inspection, no activities had begun at the site and the operator was not present during the inspection.

The project consists of drilling from four drill pads. The drill sites are not marked on the ground, but the file includes good location information in the form of drill hole coordinates, topographic maps and aerial photos. Two of the drill sites, Site 3 and Site 4, are easily accessible, being close to a maintained County/BLM road. These two drill sites were inspected. They are on gently sloping ground, that wheeled or tracked equipment can access and navigate. Typical rangeland vegetation was observed: bluegrama, fringed sage, broom snakeweed, and rabbitbrush, with minor amounts of yucca and prickly pear. There were no existing disturbances or annual weeds. A nearby gully exhibited approximately 8-12 inches of dark topsoil. The operator is urged to protect all available topsoil for later use in reclaiming the drill sites, and to promptly seed the disturbed areas with the BLM-approved seed mixes.

Drill sites 1 and 2 were not inspected at this time, due to their being approximately 0.5 mile up Boland Canyon, whose posted sign indicated that it is closed to (unauthorized) vehicle access. Those sites will be inspected later this summer when this inspector's schedule allows more time for accessing the sites on foot. The operator has provided a bond that has been accepted. Drilling activities may therefore begin.
