**Re: Seneca II Mine (Permit No. C-1980-005)
Technical Revision No. 53 (TR-53)
Termination of Water Quality Monitoring.**

Dear Sir or Madam:

The Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety hereby issues notice, in accordance with Title 34, Article 33, Section 116, Paragraph 4, of the Colorado Revised Statutes, that on August 21, 2014 an application to revise coal mining operations at the Seneca II Mine was considered complete for the purposes of filing. The revision was submitted by Seneca Coal Company, LLC. All review and comment periods as provided in the Act and the Regulations initiate from this date of filing.

Technical Revision No. 53 requests the approval for final termination of the water monitoring program as described in the approved mining permit C-1980-005 for the Seneca II Mine. Seneca II Mine proposes to terminate monitoring of four ground water monitoring wells and three surface water monitoring sites. The applicant is not proposing additional surface disturbance outside of the area currently approved for disturbance.

The surface coal mining operation is on land located approximately 9 miles Southeast of Hayden, Colorado. The permit area is further described as follows:

T5N, R87W; Portion of Sections 1 and 12
T5N, R86W: Portion of Sections 6 and 7

T5N, R86W; Portions of Sections 6 and 7.



The above-mentioned tracts of land are shown on the following USGS 7.5 minute Quadrangle map(s): Mount Harris.

Because the above referenced technical revision application may incorporate additional lands into the permit area or might otherwise alter previously approved permit conditions or mitigation measures, the Division is coordinating with the Office of Surface Mining on evaluation of the potential for impacts to threatened or endangered species of plants or animals, or wildlife species otherwise protected by federal law. A copy of the permit section addressing potential effects of the operation to threatened and endangered (T&E) species has been forwarded to the Office of Surface Mining. The OSM will prepare any biological assessment necessary for approval based on the information provided in the application, and OSM will coordinate with your office as necessary. This coordination is required to ensure mitigation of potential impacts to federally protected wildlife species.

The applicant is required to publish notice in the *Steamboat Pilot* that this application has been deemed complete. At the time of publication of this notice, the applicant is additionally required to place a copy of this application at the Hayden Public Library, 201 E. Jefferson Avenue, Hayden, CO 81639, and at the Division office. In order for us to comply with regulatory time frames, we request that comments be submitted within ten (10) days of this letter.
