## Notice of Proposed Decision

The Colorado Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety has issued a proposed decision to partially approve Bond Release Application No. 5 (SL-5) for the Seneca II-W Mine, Permit No. C-1982-057. The Division proposes to release 800.8 acres from Phase II bond liability. The surface operation is operated by Seneca Coal Company, LLC under the provisions of the Colorado Surface Coal Mining Reclamation Act of 1979. The bond release application was submitted by Seneca Coal Company, LLC on May 15, 2013. The affected area is located in Routt County, approximately 9 miles South of Hayden, Colorado.
