#### CONDITIONS FOR APPROVAL

The proposed operation does not anticipate exposing groundwater. Therefore, exposure of ground water must not occur during or after mining operations.

**COMMENTS:** The application seeks an amendment to add 12.15 acre to the currently permitted 20.1 acres, for a total permit area of 32.25 acres. The amendment is sought as a result of a resurvey to bring the existing pit inbounds for reclamation.

The primary commodity mined at the site is gravel. The site is proposed to be reclaimed to its premining land use of rangeland.

No groundwater is anticipated to be exposed at the site, and no use of water was identified as either a part of mining operations or reclamation operations. If water is proposed to be used at the site for any purpose, the applicant will need to document that the water was obtained from a legal source, or diverted in priority under a water right decreed for such industrial use.

Thank you for your correspondence dated June 27, 2014 (received by our office on June 30, 2014) regarding the subject project.

A search of the Colorado Cultural Resource Inventory database indicated that no cultural resource inventories have taken place in the vicinity of the proposed project area and no historic properties have been recorded within the subject property. However, our files contain incomplete information for this area, as most of Colorado has not been inventoried for cultural resources. As a result, there is the possibility that as yet unidentified cultural resources exist within the proposed project area.

Should human remains be discovered during the proposed project activities, the requirements under State law C.R.S. 24-80 (part 13) apply and must be followed.



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

#### **RECLAMATION PLAN**

- A. Overburden will be replaced.
- B. **Maximum gradient** Any Slopes Created will be graded no steeper than 3h:lv, unless approved by the Division.
- C. Topsoiling and seeding All stockpiled topsoil will be used exclusively for reclamation. Topsoil will be spread uniformly over the disturbed area to a packed depth of 6 inches. In the event that existing soils have insufficient depth, topsoil shall be brought in and spread over the deficient areas. The pit will be seeded during the last year of operation. (See Item 'A'). Seedbed should be well settled and firm, but not friable for seed replacement.

The Natural Resources Conservation Service has recommended the following seed



- A. Seedbed Preparation The total area to be seeded will include all disturbed areas. The seedbed will be well settled and firm, but not friable, for seed placement. Soils that have been compacted by equipment will be tilled to break up rooting restrictive layers, then harrowed, rolled or packed to prepare the required firm seedbed. Grass seed will be drilled using a grass drill from November 1st to April 30th, prior to a period of anticipated moisture and after all other treatment is completed. Recommended planting depth is ½ to ¾ inches. See (above) CO-ECS
- E. **Fertilization and Weed Control** Manure will be spread on the prepared surface at the rate of 20 tons per acre; or nitrogen (N) and phosphorus (P2O5) fertilizer will be applied and incorporated at a rate of 40 lbs. per acre each. Time of application will be immediately prior to seeding. If manure is applied, the manure will be of a type that has 60% or more, by weight, heavy chunks 5 inches or more

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
reclaimed for Rangeland purposes.


- H. **No Structures** or water features will remain after reclamation.
- I. Erosion Control. Manure will be spread on the prepared surface at the rate of 20 tons per acre; or nitrogen (N) and phosphorus (P2O5) fertilizer will be applied and incorporated at a rate of 40 lbs. per acre each. Time of application should be immediately prior to seeding. If manure is applied, the manure will be of a type that has 60% or more, by weight, heavy chunks 5 inches or more in diameter. Granular or powdery manure will not be used. If nitrogen and phosphorus are applied, a native hay or straw mulch will be spread and crimped into the soil at a rate of 4000 lbs. per acre after fertilizing. Mulch will be crimped into the soil in such a way that 6 inches of mulch protrudes from the soil surface. These measures will help control wind and water erosion until the grass becomes established.
- J. Reclaimed areas will be protected from grazing and trampling until the seed is well established (generally a minimum of two years from the time of seeding). Weeds will be controlled by mowing as appropriate during seedling establishment.
  - Long-term erosion control will be accomplished by maintenance of the specified vegetation on the landfill and maintenance of the drainage structures and contours.
- K. Post Closure Site Maintenance. Post closure maintenance will be performed, as needed, based on routine inspections of the site. Inspection of the site will include checking for:
  - surface soil cracking;
  - ponding;
  - erosion:
  - proper slope;
  - proper drainage;
  - erosion of channels;
  - monitoring station conditions; and
  - vegetative cover conditions.
- L. **Hydrologic Effects**. Not applicable in this case. After reclamation there will be no detrimental hydrologic effects, no off-site drainage, proposed future land use is Rangeland.
- M. **Reclamation Costs**. Anticipated reclamation costs associated with the proposed pit area are shown as cost per acre. All costs include labor. The area of the pit to be reclaimed is 32.25 acres.
