OBSERVATIONS

This was a routine inspection conducted by the Division as part of its monitoring of Hard Rock and Metals prospecting NOIs. The operator was not present during the inspection, and the site was not active on the day of the inspection. In addition to the inspector named on page one, also present during the inspection was Lucas West of DRMS. Due to a fallen tree across the roadway, access to the site was gained on foot. The site has been inactive and is presumed to be in final reclamation for the last several years.

The project involved drilling up to three drill holes, all along a bend in a historic mining road west of the Red Arrow Mine property, approximately 0.4 miles west of the Mill Level portal. There was no prospecting equipment on the site. There were no cuttings, drilling debris or other project-related features observed onsite. The road surface exhibits no erosion and it is adequately vegetated and stable. During the Division's 2011 inspection, only one drill hole location was found. It was located at the bend of the roadway, and since it was still open, the operator was instructed to close it. Promptly after that inspection, the operator provided photos of the closure: the casing was cut off, and a steel cap was welded on to permanently close it. During this current inspection, no sign of the capped drill hole or any other drill disturbance was observed.

Since the prospect drilling program may be completed, and all disturbance appears to be fully reclaimed, the site would be eligible for bond release. The operator is reminded that a bond release action begins when a complete release request is submitted by the operator. For a description of the information that must be provided by the operator, please refer to Hard rock and Metals Rule 4.16.

The operator is reminded that in order for the Division to consider approving a release request, all annual report and annual fee requirements must be up-to-date, and permanent drill hole abandonment reports for all drilling must be filed.
