OBSERVATIONS

The South Fork Gravel Pit was inspected by Peter Hays with the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety (Division) as part of the Division's monitoring inspection program. Mr. Bill Clark with Grand County Department of Road and Bridge was present during the inspection. The site was previously inspected by the Division on August 19, 2010.

The South Fork Pit is permitted for 5.57 acres with a maximum mined depth of 20 feet. No mining activities were observed during this inspection. According to annual reports submitted by Grand County, stockpiled material was last removed from the site in May 2013. The size of the material stockpile in the north end of the site was reduced by approximately half the previous volume since the last inspection. Grand County expects to mine and process material at the site again in the next 2 years.

No reclamation activity was observed at the site during the inspection. The topsoil stockpile located in the south end of the site was observed during the inspection. An entrance sign was posted and permit boundary markers (metal t-posts and painted blue trees) were observed as required by Rule 3.1.12.

No problems were noted during this inspection. Photographs from the inspection are attached.




