Notice of Proposed Decision

The Colorado Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety has issued a proposed decision to approve Bond Release Application No. 2 (SL-2) for the Munger Canyon Mine, Permit No. C-1981-020. The underground operation is operated by CAM Mining, LLC under the provisions of the Colorado Surface Coal Mining Reclamation Act of 1979. The bond release application was submitted by CAM Mining, LLC on September 3, 2014. CAM Mining, LLC is requesting a bond release for the Munger Canyon Mine and the associated loadout, Loma Loadout. Phases I and II bond release is being requested at the Munger Canyon Mine site and phase III bond release is being requested at the Loma Loadout. The affected area is located in Garfield, Mesa County, approximately 18 miles North of Loma, Colorado.

Any person who has an interest which is or may be adversely affected may request an adjudicatory hearing regarding this proposed decision. Requests for a hearing must be made in writing within thirty (30) days of the first publication of this notice, and shall state with reasonable specificity the reasons for the request and objections to the proposed decision.
