Notice of Proposed Decision

The Colorado Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety has issued a proposed decision to approve Bond Release Application No. 7 (SL-7) for the Keenesburg Strip Mine, Permit No. C-1981-028. The SL7 bond release application for the Keenesburg Strip Mine is for Phase I bond release on 27.1 acres within reclamation parcels 30, 31 and 32 at the site. The surface operation is operated by Coors Energy Company under the provisions of the Colorado Surface Coal Mining Reclamation Act of 1979. The bond release application was submitted by Coors Energy Company on December 12, 2014. The SL7 bond release application for the Keenesburg Strip Mine is for Phase I bond release on 27.1 acres within reclamation parcels 30, 31 and 32 at the site. The affected area is located in Weld County, approximately 7 miles North of Keenesburg, Colorado.

Any person who has an interest which is or may be adversely affected may request an adjudicatory hearing regarding this proposed decision. Requests for a hearing must be made in writing within thirty (30) days of the first publication of this notice, and shall state with reasonable specificity the reasons for the request and objections to the proposed decision.
