Attached you will find a copy of the one-line letter I received from Crossfire's agent, the proof of publication for the legal notice that came with the letter, and a copy of the envelope it came in showing a postage date of April 24, 2015. Attached is also a map of the location published in the legal notice. This published location is nowhere near the actual location.

I am very concerned that the legal notice as published describes the wrong location. Anyone living in or near Bondad, the site of the proposed gravel pit, would have no idea that this activity is being contemplated in their area-- because the location published in the newspaper is **12 miles away from the actual site**. The applicant should be required to publish the CORRECT information in the newspaper and contact everyone who lives or owns property in the Bondad area, providing them with this information.

Until a new legal notice is published and neighboring property owners are informed, a new comment period should be opened of sufficient length to allow them time to receive and assess the information, and still have time to make comments. Posting a comment period that closed before affected people were even notified is at best neglectful, and at worst downright malicious corporate obfuscation.

I don't know what the legal requirements are for notifying potentially impacted neighbors, but in this case, it is my opinion that everyone who lives in the southern Animas valley east of the proposed site, and at least a mile north and south should be notified. The winds in the area are mostly from west to east, but can be from any direction at times. Therefore, anyone living or working east, north, or south of the site will be impacted by any dust, noise, and truck traffic produced by such an operation.

I did not see any proposed access route for the gravel pit trucks and equipment. Large and heavy trucks in this area will wreak havoc on local roads and traffic patterns. Crossfire-Bonds should not be hauling gravel and using local roads until they can prove that the traffic produced by this pit will not cause a safety hazard in the area-and have addressed other traffic, safety, hours of operation, and noise issues.

Please don't let this Crossfire-Bonds proposal proceed on the basis of a botched public notification process—unintended or otherwise.




