Notice of Proposed Decision

The Colorado Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety has issued a proposed decision to approve Bond Release Application No. 6 (SL-6) for the West Elk Mine, Permit No. C-1980-007. The underground operation is operated by Mountain Coal Company, LLC under the provisions of the Colorado Surface Coal Mining Reclamation Act of 1979. The bond release application was submitted by Mountain Coal Company, LLC on December 3, 2013. The Mountain Coal Company, LLC has submitted an application for a Phase III Bond Release for the West Elk Mine. A Phase III Bond Release is a final bond release and termination of the Division's jurisdiction for the areas requested. The proposed release is for the Lone Pine area, the Thermal Event area and the West Point area. The proposed release areas cover approximately 24.2 acres. Since this is a bond release, there will be a decrease in the mine's reclamation liability. The amount of the liability release will be determined following an application review and the bond release inspection. The affected area is located in Delta, Gunnison County, approximately 9 miles East of Paonia, Colorado.
