#### **OBSERVATIONS**

This inspection was conducted as part of the Colorado Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety normal monitoring program. The Blue Jet Mine is a 110(2) permitted site located off County Road 168, approximately 27 miles northwest of Craig in Moffat County. Amy Yeldell of the Division conducted the inspection. Mr. Orvie Zimmerman, the operator, Jennifer Maiolo of the BLM Little Snake Field Office and Russ Means of DRMS accompanied the inspector.

The permitted area is 9.9 acres. The site is largely reclaimed or undistrubed. It is estimated that less then one acre is disturbed at this time.

The mine identification sign and affected area boundary markers are in place and in compliance with Rule 3.1.12. The sign is located at the entrance to the site where the access road meets county road 168. The permit boundary is marked with several t-posts. Currently no mining activities occur near the permit boundary.

There is no equipment on site. Nor is there any fuel or other materials being stored on site. All scrap material noted in previous reports has been removed and the site remains clean. The operator is actively mining and testing material off site for mineral viability. It is estimated that 1000 lbs of material will be tested over the next year.

Late this fall the operator plans to conduct maintenance to the site by cleaning out the pond and removing sediment tracked in by livestock. No changes to the size or shape of the pond are anticipated. The operator has a valid well permit and water quality remains good.

Vegetation in the previously reclaimed areas is coming in well and remains stable. There is a high species diversity which includes grasses, forbs and shrubs. Due to good vegetation establishment there is little erosion site wide. Volunteer species have stabilized the active access road and pad, very little foot print of mining operations is evident. There are some thistle within the permit area, specifically the riparian areas. It is evident that the operator is actively spraying and digging out the undesirable species. Mr. Zimmerman is encouraged continue his efforts to promote reclamation success and avoid future infestations.

In an effort to ensure the Financial Warranty adequately, reflects the actual current cost of fulfilling the requirements of the approved reclamation plan the Division will be updating the reclamation cost estimate. A copy of the staff calculations will be sent under separate cover.


No problems or violations were noted during this inspection.


