Dear Ms. Mitchell,

Thank you for your notice on the previous inspection from February 11, 2014. As you noted in the letter, gullies and weeds, in particular Kochia, were evident on site. Today, however, the site has become re-activated as above the gravel pit area we are constructing our new water treatment facility. Earthwork is taking place over most of the site including the gravel pit and much of the gullies and weeds have been remedied simply due to the site work.

It is anticipated this activity will continue into early 2017, impacting by disturbance, staging, soil relocation the general resource pit area. After which time we again anticipate the site going into stockpile/dormant status and we certainly understand an inspection for stabilized conditions and addressing potential weed issues. We hope this provides the necessary information as required.

INSPECTION TOPIC: Backfilling & Grading

PROBLEM/POSSIBLE VIOLATION: Problem: Erosion gullies and ruts were observed on-site. This is a problem at this time for failure to protect the affected land from erosion pursuant to C.R.S. 34-32.5-116 (4) (j). **CORRECTIVE ACTIONS:** The operator shall provide photo documentation to the Division verifying erosion gullies and ruts have been repaired, and that the site has have been reconstructed and stabilized to prevent erosion damage by the corrective action date.

CORRECTIVE ACTION DUE DATE: 5/14/14

INSPECTION TOPIC: Revegetation

PROBLEM/POSSIBLE VIOLATION: Problem: There are state-listed noxious weeds present on site. This is a problem for failure to employ weed control methods for state listed noxious weed species within the permitted area, and to reduce the spread of weeds to nearby areas as required by Section 3.1.10 (6) of the rule. **CORRECTIVE ACTIONS:** Implement approved weed control plan and provide proof to the Division that this has been done. If a weed control plan is not already in place, the operator shall develop a weed control and management plan in accordance with Section 3.1.10 (6) of the Rule. This plan should be developed in consultation with the county extension agency, or weed control district office and should include specific control measures to be applied, a schedule for when control measures will be applied and a post-treatment monitoring plan. This weed control plan shall be submitted to the Division as a Technical Revision to the approved plan with the appropriate Technical Revision fee of \$216.00 by the corrective action date. **CORRECTIVE ACTION DUE DATE:** 5/15/14

OBSERVATIONS

This was a monitoring inspection of the City of Rifle Material Resource Area; M-2007-030 operated by the City of Rifle. This site is located within the city limits of Rifle, Colorado in Garfield County. I, Stephanie Mitchell of the Colorado Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety conducted the inspection. Mr. Dusty Hoaglund, of the City of Rifle Operations and Maintenance accompanied me on the inspection.

This is a 9.90 acre 110c mining operation for sand and gravel. A mine identification sign was in place at the entrance to the mine site. Permit boundaries were all clearly marked. There was no equipment on site. The site is stable and no disturbance was observed outside of the approved permit boundaries. The highwall is located in the eastern part of the permit area. Above the highwall, recent grading has taken place. On the recently graded slope, there is significant rilling and gullies forming. This issue is cited as a problem at the beginning of this report and will require corrective action to be taken by the Operator.

The site has a substantial noxious weed problem as well. In particular, Kochia, more commonly known as tumbleweed, is present all over the site. This issue is cited as a problem at the beginning of this report and will require corrective action to be taken by the Operator. Garfield County has a program that may be able to help the City of Rifle mitigate this problem. Steve Anthony, Vegetation Manager whose email is santhony@garfield-county.com may be of some assistance in resolving the noxious weed issue.

Topsoil is stockpiled at the western extent of the current disturbance and appears to be stable.
