Technical Revision No. 19 (TR-19)
Incorporate Sedimentation Control Plan for Reclamation Activities.**

Dear Mr. Velarde:

The Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety hereby issues notice, in accordance with Title 34, Article 33, Section 116, Paragraph 4, of the Colorado Revised Statutes, that on August 7, 2015 an application to revise coal mining operations at the Coal Ridge No. 1 Mine was considered complete for the purposes of filing. The revision was submitted by C.B. Minerals Company, LLC. All review and comment periods as provided in the Act and the Regulations initiate from this date of filing.

This application, Technical Revision 19 (TR 19) for Coal Ridge No. 1 Mine provides a sediment control plan for reclaimed areas associated with the reclamation of Sediment Pond A. Per the terms of the associated discharge permit (C00048972) a site specific Sediment Control Plan must be submitted to DRMS that is designed to prevent an increase in the average annual sediment yield from pre mine undisturbed conditions. The applicant is not proposing additional surface disturbance outside of the area currently approved for disturbance.

The underground coal mining operation is on land located approximately 7 miles West of Glenwood Springs, Colorado. The permit area is further described as follows:

T6S, R91W; Portions of Sections 1 and 12
T6S, R90W; Portions of Sections 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 15 and 16



The above-mentioned tracts of land are shown on the following USGS 7.5 minute Quadrangle map(s): Abarr.

Because the above referenced technical revision application may incorporate additional lands into the permit area or might otherwise alter previously approved permit conditions or mitigation measures, we are requesting your agency's evaluation of the proposal. Your comments and concerns relating to the adequacy of fish and wildlife resources information, the fish and wildlife plan, and the reclamation plan as it relates to fish and wildlife considerations, including potential impacts to threatened or endangered species, are requested. If wildlife habitat is the proposed postmining land use, we request your evaluation of any changes to proposed woody plant stocking levels, planting arrangements, and methods for mitigation of potential adverse impacts.

The applicant is required to publish notice in a local newspaper that this application has been deemed complete. At the time of publication of this notice, the applicant is additionally required to place a copy of this application at the Garfield County Clerk and Recorder, 109 8th Street, Suite 200, Glenwood Springs, CO 81601, and at the Division office. In order for us to comply with regulatory time frames, we request that comments be submitted within fifteen (15) days of this letter. If no comments are received by then, we will proceed on the assumption that you have no concerns with, or objections to, the applicant's proposal.
