Dear Sir or Madam:

The Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety hereby issues notice, in accordance with Title 34, Article 33, Section 116, Paragraph 4, of the Colorado Revised Statutes, that on August 7, 2015 an application to revise coal mining operations at the Coal Ridge No. 1 Mine was considered complete for the purposes of filing. The revision was submitted by C.B. Minerals Company, LLC. All review and comment periods as provided in the Act and the Regulations initiate from this date of filing.

This application, Technical Revision 19 (TR 19) for Coal Ridge No. 1 Mine provides a sediment control plan for reclaimed areas associated with the reclamation of Sediment Pond A. Per the terms of the associated discharge permit (C00048972) a site specific Sediment Control Plan must be submitted to DRMS that is designed to prevent an increase in the average annual sediment yield from pre mine undisturbed conditions. The applicant is not proposing additional surface disturbance outside of the area currently approved for disturbance.

The underground coal mining operation is on land located approximately 7 miles West of Glenwood Springs, Colorado. The permit area is further described as follows:

T6S, R91W; Portions of Sections 1 and 12

T6S, R90W; Portions of Sections 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 15 and 16



The above-mentioned tracts of land are shown on the following USGS 7.5 minute Quadrangle map(s): Abarr.

Because the above referenced technical revision application may incorporate additional lands into the permit area or might otherwise alter previously approved permit conditions or mitigation measures, the Division is coordinating with the Office of Surface Mining on evaluation of the potential for impacts to threatened or endangered species of plants or animals, or wildlife species otherwise protected by federal law. A copy of the permit section addressing potential effects of the operation to threatened and endangered (T&E) species has been forwarded to the Office of Surface Mining. The OSM will prepare any biological assessment necessary for approval based on the information provided in the application, and OSM will coordinate with your office as necessary. This coordination is required to ensure mitigation of potential impacts to federally protected wildlife species.

The applicant is required to publish notice in the *Glenwood Springs Post Independent* that this application has been deemed complete. At the time of publication of this notice, the applicant is additionally required to place a copy of this application at the Garfield County Clerk and Recorder, 109 8th Street, Suite 200, Glenwood Springs, CO 81601, and at the Division office. In order for us to comply with regulatory time frames, we request that comments be submitted within ten (10) days of this letter.
