NOTICE OF PROPOSED DECISION

The Colorado Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety proposes to approve Technical Revision Application No. 19 (TR-19) for the Coal Ridge No. 1 Mine (Permit No. C-1984-065), submitted by C.B. Minerals Company, LLC. This application, Technical Revision 19 (TR 19) for Coal Ridge No. 1 Mine provides a sediment control plan for reclaimed areas associated with the reclamation of Sediment Pond A. Per the terms of the associated discharge permit (C00048972) a site specific Sediment Control Plan must be submitted to DRMS that is designed to prevent an increase in the average annual sediment yield from pre mine undisturbed conditions.

The Coal Ridge No. 1 Mine is a/an underground coal mine located in Garfield County, approximately 7 miles W of Glenwood Springs, Colorado. Coal interest is private, and the surface affected is private land. The permit area encompasses approximately 2,484.30 acres.

This proposed decision is based on a finding that the proposed operation will comply with all requirements of the Colorado Surface Coal Mining Reclamation Act, Section 34-33-101, *et seq.*, C.R.S., and the regulations promulgated thereunder.

Copies of the proposed decision, including stipulations, are on file for public inspection at the Colorado Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety, Room 215, Centennial Building, 1313 Sherman Street, Denver, Colorado 80203. Persons with an interest that may be adversely affected by the proposed decision may request a formal hearing before the Mined Land Reclamation Board on the proposed decision. Such request must be made within ten (10) days of the initial publication of this notice, must be in writing, and must state with reasonable specificity the reasons for the request and the objections to the proposed decision.
