## Notice of Proposed Decision

The Colorado Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety has issued a proposed decision to approve Bond Release Application No. 8 (SL-8) for the Colowyo Coal Mine, Permit No. C-1981-019. Partial Phase I Bond Release at the West, East and South Taylor Pit. The surface operation is operated by Colowyo Coal Company L.P. under the provisions of the Colorado Surface Coal Mining Reclamation Act of 1979. The bond release application was submitted by Colowyo Coal Company L.P. on May 20, 2015. SL-08 is a Phase I bond release application. The area includes several discontinuous parcels with a total of 189.6 acres. The affected area is located in Moffat, Rio Blanco County, approximately 28 miles South of Craig, Colorado.
