## **OBSERVATIONS**

This normal routine monitoring inspection was conducted by Tyler O'Donnell of the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety (Division). Lazy H Inc (Operator), was represented by William Havengar during the first portion of the inspection.

The Bootleg Quarry is located in Adams County approximately 10.5 miles east/southeast of Lochbuie, Colorado. The Bootleg Quarry is a 5.5-acre 111c Construction Materials Reclamation Permit. The primary commodity mined at the site is sand and gravel. The 111c Construction Materials Reclamation Permit was issued in June of 2015. The approved post-mining land use is rangeland. The mine site was surrounded by the following land uses: rangeland, and residential.

During the inspection, the sky was clear and the ground was dry. Mining Operations just began late this spring. The site was active during the inspection. At the present time it appears that the mining operation has affected approximately 1 acre throughout the life of mine. All mining activity appeared to be within the approved affected land boundary. The internal pit haul roads and the access road appear to have been just constructed and were stable. The eastern portions of the pit daylight. There was no evidence of excessive erosion. It appears that topsoil had been salvaged in advance of mining. There were topsoil berms along the perimeter of the current excavation. The amount of topsoil salvaged appears to be adequate to complete final reclamation. It appears that the permit boundary was marked with survey stakes, the Operator is encouraged to use a more permanent monument to mark the permit boundary. The reclamation cost estimate for this site was updated during the file review for this inspection. It was determined that the current required financial warranty amount is adequate.
