OBSERVATIONS

The Lehr Gravel Pit was inspected by Peter Hays with the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety (Division/DRMS) at the request of Mrs. Tina Booton with Weld County. Mrs. Booton, the Weed Division Supervisor for Weld County Public Works, was present during the inspection.

During the previous inspection on June 30, 2016, the following noxious weeds were identified by the Division: Downy brome (cheatgrass), a List C Colorado Noxious Weed, along the access road, the north, south and west pit slopes and on the pit floor, Hoary Cress (whitetop) and musk thistle, List B Colorado Noxious weeds on the pit floor.

The Weld County Weed Division inspected the site following the Division's inspection. The County inspector failed to find evidence of white top or musk thistle, but did find Dalmatian toadflax, field bindweed and Canada thistle. The County identified noxious weeds were treated with Tordon. Evidence of the chemical spraying were observed during this inspection. The cheatgrass was treated with Esplanade in July according to the County.

The previously identified white top and musk thistle were not observed during this inspection. In appears, yellow spiky thistle was misidentified as musk thistle by the Division. The white top identified by the Division in the southwest portion of the pit floor was not observed during this inspection.

The interseeding of the site with the updated seed mixture approved under technical revision no. 1 has not been schedule, typically the County prefers to interseed sites in the late fall to early winter.
