OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted as part of the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety's (Division) normal monitoring program. Photographs are included with this report in order to illustrate some of the conditions observed.

The Ready Mix Pit is located approximately one mile south of Gunnison and accessed from CR38. The site is a 112c operation that includes a total of 61.6 permitted acres. The Division currently holds a financial warranty amount of \$115,814.00 for this site. The Division has reviewed the reclamation costs, in order to ensure the financial warranty reflects the actual current cost of fulfilling the requirements of the Reclamation Plan, and determined that the current financial warranty amount is adequate.

Adequate mine identification signage was noted at the entrance to the site.

The affected area was marked by fencing that was clearly visible and adequate to delineate the affected area boundary.

This pit is active. Mining has created a series of ponds. The ponds in the south part of the permit area were mined prior to United's acquiring the property. As has been noted in previous inspection reports, final grading of the slopes around the older ponds has not been completed.

There are two active ponds on the north side of the older ponds. The active pond on the east side was being dewatered during this inspection. Halogeton and mullein were noted on the berms around the active pits. These noxious weeds should be addressed through the sites weed management program.

North of the ponds is the processing and stockpile areas. Crushing was occurring during this inspection.

No other problems or violations were noted during this inspection.
