## **OBSERVATIONS**

This pre-operation inspection was conducted in response to a request for a new 112c Reclamation Permit Application and an amendment to the permit application for the Pueblo County Aggregate Project, File No. M-2016-009. Elliott Russell, with the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety (Division or DRMS), inspected the site. John Paul Ary and Lexi Swearingen accompanied the inspection and represented the Applicant, Fremont Paving & Redi-Mix, Inc.

The 112c construction materials permit application was received by the Division on February 19, 2016. The application was deemed complete for filing purposes on February 26, 2016. The Applicant published public notice as required by Rule 1.6.2(d) for four consecutive weeks. The public comment period closed on April 15, 2016. During the public comment period, the Division received 9 objections. On June 10, 2016, the Applicant filed an amendment to the application. The amendment to the application was deemed complete for filing purposes on June 14, 2016. The Applicant published public notice as required by Rule 1.6.2(d) for four consecutive weeks. The public comment period closed on April 15, 2016 additional objections.

The application proposes a 1,517 acre permit area with, approximately 300 acres being mined throughout the life of mine in in four specific phases. The mining operation proposes extracting sand and gravel on top of the Cascajo Gravel Terraces, also commonly known as the Badger Hills, which are the remnants of a historic river terrace.

The proposed site is located roughly 12 miles east-southeast of Pueblo, Colorado. The public notice required by Rule 1.6.2(1)(b) was posted and observed at four locations: 36<sup>th</sup> Lane, 40<sup>th</sup> Lane, Oslen Road, and Highway 50. Existing vegetative cover at the site mainly consisted of grasses with various forbs/shrubs. Blue grama, sideoats grama, purple three-awn, ring muhly, sand dropseed, fringe sage, yucca, and tree cholla and prickly pear cacti was observed during the inspection.

During the inspection, the Division observed the following structures that could be within 200 feet of the proposed permit boundary that are not identified in the permit application in Exhibit C or Exhibit S. The Applicant shall verify these are within 200 feet of the permit boundary are comply with Rule 6.4.19.

- Underground utility line along the west side of 36<sup>th</sup> Lane.
- Overhead utility line on the east side of 36<sup>th</sup> Lane.
- Underground utility line on the west side of 40<sup>th</sup> Lane.
- Overhead utility line on the east side of 40<sup>th</sup> Lane.
- Underground utility line on the north side of Olsen Road.
- Overhead utility line on the Bregar property.
- Underground and overhead utility line on the north side of McHarg Road.
- Irrigation lateral and underground utility lines on the north side of Highway 50.
