GENERAL INSPECTION TOPICS

OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted as part of the normal monitoring program established by the Colorado Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety. The Costilla Pt is an active 110(c) operation in final reclamation that is operated by and located in Costilla County. The site is located Just off County Road GG, just south of Ft. Garland at approximately 7880 Feet in Elevation. Access to the site is controlled by a locked cable gate. The Division does not hold a financial warranty for the site as it is operated by a County government and no such warranty is required. Three Photos accompany this report to illustrate the current site conditions.

Proper mind identification signage was posted on site, shown in Photo One. Permit boundary markers were also observed on site. The site was not active nor was any equipment present on site. All backfilling and grading of the site has been completed, no evidence of settling, slumping or subsidence was observed. The site has been backfilled a near flat configuration shown in Photo Two. The area appears to be stable and in good condition, no signs of erosion were noted. The site is to be reclaimed to support an industrial / commercial post mining land use. On site discussions with the operator indicate that this site may be selected for the installation of a small solar farm operated by Costilla County.

Reclamation of the site has been completed. The site is currently vegetated with range and bunch grasses, sage and rabbit brushes as well as a large population of sunflowers. The vegetation, shown in Photo Three, is diverse, and capable of self-regeneration. Discussions with the operator indicate that weed management is continuous and on-going at the site. The grading and earthwork, as well as the vegetation on site appear to be stable, and adequate when compared to adjacent undisturbed lands. The Division recommends that the operator submit a request for complete release of the permit. Enclosed with this report is the form for the request for full or partial release of permit area for the operator to complete and return to the Division. The request must be completed in accordance with Rule 4.17.1 of the Rules for the Extraction of Construction Materials, and sent via certified mail, separate from any other correspondence to the Division's Denver office. If the request is received within **60 days** of the date of this report, this inspection will be considered the release inspection, in accordance with Rule 4.17.2 (2).

The overall footprint of the site was in good condition and free from trash and debris. The site also exhibited positive drainage and no signs of erosion were noted during the inspection. No problems, or possible violations were observed at this time.
