PROBLEM/POSSIBLE VIOLATION: Problem: Rule 1.13.5 states, if an Operator temporarily ceases production of the mining operation for one hundred eighty (180) days or more, the Operator must file a Notice of Temporary Cessation in writing to the Office.

CORRECTIVE ACTIONS: The Division recommends the Operator file for Temporary Cessation. The start date of the initial 5 year Temporary Cessation period is retroactive to the last date the pit was active. If that date is more than 5 years ago, the operator is required ask the Board for a 5 year extension to the Temporary Cessation period (per rule 1.13.5 (3) and 1.13.8 (b) or begin reclamation.

OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted as part of the Colorado Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety normal monitoring program. The Juniper Mountain Gravel site is a 112c gravel operation that consists of 60 acres with a max disturbance of 15 acres. No operator representative was present during the inspection. Amy Yeldell of the Division conducted the inspection. The site is located in Moffat County approximately two mile southeast of Maybell, Colorado and is accessed from Moffat County Road 57.

The mine identification sign and affected area boundary markers are in place and in compliance with Rule 3.1.12. The mine sign was located at the main entrance as you leave CR 57. The boundary is delineated by a fence on the east side and t-post on the remaining sides.

No fuel was stored on site. A drill seeder and metal skid building were stored on site.

Less than 15 acres is disturbed. There are several small highwalls scattered throughout the site. It doesn't appear that any one area has been mined out completely or that reclamation has intentionally been completed. Large amounts of volunteer vegetation has established unfortunately the site requires additional grading so many of these areas will have to be disturbed. There are several large stockpiles of various material types located throughout the site.

The remaining regarding for this site consists of flattening stockpiles and highwall reductions. The majority of reclamation liability consist of topsoil replacement and seeding.

Several weeds were observed. It is too late in the year to effectively treat them. The Division strongly recommends that you spray for all noxious weeds and implement the approved weed management plan. The site conditions appear to be similar to the informal inspection conducted on November 24, 2015. Staff as a courtesy reviewed the site with the new company owners and discussed potential outcomes for the mine site. The site has begun to self-reclaim due to inactivity for a prolonged period. This is cited as a problem. The operator shall notify the Division of its intent to begin final reclamation in writing or be subject to Rule 1.13 regarding activity levels. The form to request temporary cessation status is included with this report. The operator may also request intermittent status. Please notify the Division in writing within 60 days of this inspection.

Active status requires mining annually more than 180 days which this operation does not do. Intermittent status requires that a site be active annually however does not operate more than 180 days a year. If the mine ceases production for more than a year it shall go into temporary cessation.

If the operator notifies the Divisions of its intent to begin final reclamation within 60 days of this report and begins reclamation activities in 2017 the Division will consider the current bond amount of \$43,721 adequate.

The Division will schedule a follow up inspection in fall of 2017 to reevaluate the bond after reclamation activities have commenced. If the Division does not receive notice of final reclamation then the Division will update the reclamation cost estimate, which will result in a surety increase. Attached is the reclamation cost estimate which is based on a worst case scenario per the approved plans. It is noted that the bond has not been increased since the permit issuance in 2003.

The Division has not received your 2016 annual report, map and fee. <u>This is cited as a problem</u>. Please submit the report by the corrective action date.
