Dear, Ms. Yeldell:

On behalf of Cecil "Cork" Powell, owner of Vista Del Sol Ranch and operator of the Powell Gravel Pit (M1995012), Great Basin Environmental and Aquatics (GBEA) is submitting a request for an extension as requested.

I apologize for the considerable amount of information that may seem ambiguous but having worked in research for 15 years I have a tendency to prattle excessively; although it does come in useful at times.

A concise summary of the addendum:

- 1. Slopes to be 2/1 or gentler on 1.43 acres defined in polygon A
- 2. Materials to move 350 ft of slopes reduced to 2/1 or gentler, +- 1000 yd³
- 3. Topsoil as available and supplement with amendments, using a cover crop over one or two growing seasons
- Intensively reclaim on 1.43 acres of mined area polygon A, maintain and seed as needed 1.42 acres on polygon B, maintain mature vegetation on 0.50 acres in polygon B, maintain 1.03 acres of reclaimed area.
- 5. Broadcast seed and harrow or walk in with dozer tracks.
- 6. If the hill is mined outside of polygons A,B, and C, Mr Powell will become responsible for reclaiming.
- 7. Straw, if used, is at a minimum of 1 ton/ acre, depending on equipment etc. Preferably turn in a cover crop and use as a planting medium. Note: straw sources for Mr. Powell are in Loma 200 miles round trip. He has been encouraged to use any organic waste from his ranching.
- 8. Control weeds as per Appendix C.
