OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted as part of the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety's (Division) normal monitoring program. A representative for the operator was not present during this inspection. Photographs are included with this report in order to illustrate some of the conditions observed.

The Angie Pit is located approximately one mile southeast of Redvale and accessed from 3575 Road. The site is a 112c operation that includes a total of 154 permitted acres. The Division currently holds a financial warranty amount of \$103,365.00 for this site.

Adequate mine identification signage was noted at the entrance to the site.

The affected area was marked by posts and fencing that were clearly visible and adequate to delineate the affected area boundary.

There was no activity occurring at the site during this inspection. Materials stockpiles are located throughout the pit floor. The south highwall remains at a near vertical slope near the permit boundary. Some fill material has been placed against the east and north pit slopes, but grading to 3H:1V is not complete. Slopes in the northwest part of the Phase 1 area are graded to 3H:1V with moderate vegetation established.

No problems or violations were noted during this inspection.
