Dear Mr. Clark:

On February 7, 2017, the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety (Division) received your response to the Division's inquiry, RE: "Is It Mining". The Division has assigned File No. M-2017-010 to these proceedings; please display the file number on all subsequent communications.

The information you provided indicates you desire to conduct a surface mining operation within or nearby riparian areas located on USFS lands and more specifically in Park County. Recovered gold will be removed from site and sold.

The Colorado Mined Land Reclamation Board (Board) has requested the Division make preliminary determinations regarding the need for a mined land reclamation permit. Based on the information provided in your response, it is the Division's determination the proposed project is a mining operation. Pursuant to Colorado law, you are required to first obtain a mined land reclamation permit from the Board prior to initiating the mining operation. If you disagree with the Division's determination you may petition the Board for administrative appeal, in accordance with Rule 1.4.11 of the Mineral Rules and Regulations of the Colorado Mined Land Reclamation Board for Hard Rock, Metal, and Designated Mining Operations. A copy of the reclamation statute and associated rules and regulations are available through the Division's web site at http://mining.state.co.us. Pursuant to Rule 1.4.11(1)(b), such petition must be received by the Division within 30 days, due April 14, 2017.
