
Dear Ms. Yeldell:

We received your correspondence dated March 13, 2017 on March 15, 2017 initiating consultation
with our office under the State Register of Historic Places Act (CRS 24-80-1 et seq.) for the above
referenced project.

A search of our database indicates that no cultural resource inventory has been conducted within the
proposed permit area and no properties of historical significance have been recorded therein. As most
of Colorado has not been inventoried for cultural resources, our files contain incomplete information.
Consequently there is the possibility that as yet unidentified cultural resources exist within the
proposed permit area. The requirements under CRS 24-80 part 13 apply and must be followed if
human remains are discovered during ground disturbing activities.
