## **OBSERVATIONS**

This inspection was conducted as part of the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety's (Division) normal monitoring program. Norm David, representing the Operator, was present during this inspection. Photographs are included with this report in order to illustrate some of the conditions observed.

The LaSalle Pit is located approximately three miles northwest of Montrose and accessed from 6175 Road. The site is a 112c operation that includes a total of 27.76 permitted acres. Pursuant to Rule 4.1.2 (2), a financial warranty is not required for this site.

Adequate mine identification signage was noted at the entrance to the site.

The affected area was marked by fencing and posts that were clearly visible and adequate to delineate the affected area boundary.

Mining and crushing were occurring during this inspection. Since the Division's last inspection, mining has progressed further south in the Phase 1 area and the pit floor is now at a depth of approximately 20 feet. Highwalls are 1H:1V to near vertical around the mined area. Most of the materials stockpiles are now located on the pit floor in the Phase 1 area. Topsoil has been stripped from much of the site and used to create a visual berm around the perimeter of the site.

No problems or violations were noted during this inspection.
