


This office has reviewed the information provided by Vic Eklund on March 9, 1993 concerning the above proposed project.

A search of our files has revealed that there are no known cultural resource sites located within the area of this pit expansion. Due to previous disturbance from the existing mine and the construction of the water treatment plant, we find that there will be no effect to cultural resources by continued use of this pit.

If previously unidentified archaeological resources are discovered in the course of the project, work must be interrupted until the resources have been evaluated in terms of the State Register eligibility criteria, in consultation with this office.
