I represent the landowners Beverly J and Marvin D Kembel, owners of property situated due West of the Ayers Pit over which Dilley has access to Morgan County Road 23. This letter is in response to a request from Jarrod Ebert to clarify their earlier letter of March 13 concerning the written access they provided to Dilley, specifically whether the March 13 letter is to be considered a formal objection to the application requiring a hearing. It is **not** a formal objection.

However, Kembels stand on their earlier position that they are willing to extend this grant of entry on an annual basis for the proposed period of time identified in Table D-2 of the application, but they are not willing to grant such access until September, 2025.
