# **COMMENTS**

This was an aerial inspection of the New Horizon Mine conducted by Harry Ranney and Brock Bowles of the Colorado Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety. Aerial photos were taken on April 11, 2017 at approximately 10:32 am. Brock Bowles reviewed the aerial photos. The weather conditions appear to be clear in the photos as objects on the ground projected shadows.

#### HYDROLOGIC BALANCE - Rule 4.05

Drainage Control 4.05.1, 4.05.2, 4.05.3; Siltation Structures 4.05.5, 4.05.6; Discharge Structures 4.05.7, 4.05.10; Diversions 4.05.4; Effluent Limits 4.05.2; Ground Water Monitoring 4.05.13; Surface Water Monitoring 4.05.13; Drainage – Acid and Toxic Materials 4.05.8; Impoundments 4.05.6, 4.05.9; Stream Buffer Zones 4.05.18:

Pond 7 contained water. The pooling area at the discharge pipe did not contain water which means pond 7 was not discharging (photo 1).

Ponds 8 and 13 contained water.

Ponds 9 and 16 did not contain water.

Pond 18 and the C4A ditch did not contain water.

## RECLAMATION SUCCESS - Rule 4.15, Rule 3:

The reclaimed irrigated pasture areas are becoming greener compared to the dryland pasture areas (photo 3). Although, it does not appear that the irrigation siderolls have been in operation. They are in the same position as they were during the last inspection.

## ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS/COMPLIANCE

No enforcement actions were initiated as a result of this inspection, nor are any pending.




Photo 2 – Ponds on West Side of NH2

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


Photo 3 – Irrigated And Dryland Pasture Areas
