The following inspection topics were identified as having Problems or Possible Violations. INSPECTION TOPIC: Availability Of Records

PROBLEM/POSSIBLE VIOLATION: Problem: Rule 1.13.5 states, if an Operator temporarily ceases production of the mining operation for one hundred eighty (180) days or more, the Operator must file a Notice of Temporary Cessation in writing to the Office.

CORRECTIVE ACTIONS: The Division recommends the Operator file for Temporary Cessation. The start date of the initial 5 year Temporary Cessation period is retroactive to the last date the pit was active. If that date is more than 5 years ago, the operator is required to ask the Board for a 5 year extension to the Temporary Cessation period (per rule 1.13.5 (3) and 1.13.8 (b) or begin reclamation.

OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted as part of the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety's (Division) normal monitoring program. Rob Kisner, representing the Operator, was present during this inspection. Photographs are included with this report in order to illustrate some of the conditions observed.

The Newett Quarry is located approximately eight miles east of Buena Vista and accessed from CR 309. The site is a 112c operation that includes a total of 26 permitted acres. The Division currently holds a financial warranty amount of \$132,228.00 for this site. The Division has reviewed the reclamation costs, in order to ensure the financial warranty reflects the actual current cost of fulfilling the requirements of the Reclamation Plan, and determined that the current financial warranty amount is adequate.

Adequate mine identification signage was noted at the entrance to the site.

The affected area was marked by posts that were clearly visible and adequate to delineate the affected area boundary.

There has been no mining activity at this site since the Division's last inspection. Pursuant to Rule 1.13.5, if a mine is inactive for more than 180 days the operator must file a notice of Temporary Cessation with the Division. The operator has not submitted the notice. This has been noted as a problem. Since there has been no mining activity at this site since at least 2010, the operator will need request an extension to the 5 year period allowed by Temporary Cessation. Alternatively, the operator could commence final reclamation of the site.

Several stockpiles of crushed limestone are still located in the stockpile area. No other equipment or materials are located at the site.

Some reclamation grading in mining area B took place years ago. There has been no change since the 2013 when the Division last inspected the site. A vertical highwall still exists in this area.

Although there has been no mining activity, the stormwater controls have been maintained at the site. Straw wattles and newer silt fences were noted in several areas.

No other problems or violations were noted during this inspection.
