#### **OBSERVATIONS**

This inspection was conducted as part of the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety's (Division) normal monitoring program. A representative for the operator was not present. Photographs are included with this report in order to illustrate some of the conditions observed.

The Arnold Gulch Pit is located approximately six miles southeast of Buena Vista and accessed from CR 300. The site is a 110c operation that includes a total of 9.9 permitted acres. The Division currently holds a financial warranty amount of \$17,500.00 for this site. The Division has reviewed the reclamation costs, in order to ensure the financial warranty reflects the actual current cost of fulfilling the requirements of the Reclamation Plan, and determined that the current financial warranty amount is adequate.

Adequate mine identification signage was noted at the entrance to the site.

The affected area was marked by t-posts that were clearly visible and adequate to delineate the affected area boundary.

The operation is active. A backhoe was parked on site. The depth of the pit is approximately twenty feet, with the excavation advancing toward the southwest. The highwalls have sloughed to approximately 1H:1V. There are no stockpiles stored on site. There is no salvageable topsoil at the site, and therefore no topsoil stockpiles.

There were no concerns regarding erosion noted.

Noxious weed infestations were not observed.

No problems or violations were noted during this inspection.
