OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted as part of the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety's (Division) normal monitoring program. Mike Coleman, representing the Operator, was present during this inspection. Photographs are included with this report in order to illustrate some of the conditions observed.

The River Park Recreation Access site is located approximately 2.5 miles southeast of Buena Vista and accessed from CR 301. The site is a 110c operation that includes a total of 9.9 permitted acres. The Division currently holds a financial warranty amount of \$32,550.00 for this site. The Division has reviewed the reclamation costs, in order to ensure the financial warranty reflects the actual current cost of fulfilling the requirements of the Reclamation Plan, and determined that the current financial warranty amount is adequate.

Adequate mine identification signage was noted at the entrance to the site.

The affected area was marked by posts that were clearly visible and adequate to delineate the affected area boundary.

Mining is nearly complete at the site, with only a minor area in the south end of the pit left to be mined. Stockpiles are located on the pit floor. Where there is enough space, highwall slope reduction has commenced. The slopes are currently approximately 1H:1V around the stockpile area, and 3H:1V around the south end of the pit.

Fuel stored on site is in adequate secondary containment.

No problems or violations were noted during this inspection.
