Hi Dustin,

I have one comment regarding the proposed California Mine. The operator does not currently have legal access from the Forest Service. While the route he proposes to use to get to his claim is legal, the portion from the FS road to the actual dig sites is considered non-system, and would require a road use permit. Due to a backlog of permits, we will not be able to issue this permit until next year; therefore, the operator does not have legal access through the Forest Service until 2018.
