## **OBSERVATIONS**

This inspection was conducted as part of the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety's (Division) normal monitoring program. Randy Robins and Scott Johnson, representing the Operator, were present during this inspection. Photographs are included with this report in order to illustrate some of the conditions observed.

The Robins Pit No. 1 is located approximately ten miles west of Antonito and accessed from CR D.5. The site is a 112c operation that includes a total of 18.5 permitted acres. The Division currently holds a financial warranty amount of \$41,834.71 for this site. The Division has reviewed the reclamation costs, in order to ensure the financial warranty reflects the actual current cost of fulfilling the requirements of the Reclamation Plan, and determined that the current financial warranty amount is adequate.

Adequate mine identification signage was noted at the entrance to the site.

The affected area was marked by fencing that was clearly visible and adequate to delineate the affected area boundary.

There were no mining or reclamation activities occurring during this inspection. Approximately eleven acres are currently disturbed at the site. The pit is approximately 10-15 feet deep. Highwall around the south part of the pit has been reduced to approximately 3H:1V. The active highwall, located in the northwest end of the pit is approximately 1H:1V. Materials stockpiles are located at various locations throughout the pit floor.

No problems or violations were noted during this inspection.
