OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted as part of the normal monitoring program established by the Colorado Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety (DRMS). The ASMO RD&D Project is an in-situ Oil Shale Prospecting site located approximately 25 miles west of Rio Blanco, Colorado southwest of Piceance Creek Road. Bruce Smith of Western Water and Land Inc. accompanied DRMS staff during the inspection.

The main focus of the inspection was to observe the reclamation that has been completed at the site and observe if the revegetation efforts completed in the fall of 2016 were successful.

All components of the project were observed during the inspection. All final grading and topsoil placement was completed at the time of the November 23, 2017 inspection. All disturbed areas were seeded and mulched. Fencing to keep livestock and wildlife off of the reclaimed areas remained intact.

The seeding efforts were successful and many desirable grasses were growing along with the annual oats which are a component of the seed mix that provides shade for desirable grasses and aids with prevention of undesirable weeds during the initial growing season. Cheat grass was observed at various locations but is not seen as a problem due to the operator being aware of the infestation and having an active weed management program.

No evidence of erosion or off site damage from erosion was observed. All stormwater control structures were in good repair.

No problems or violations were observed during the inspection.
