## **OBSERVATIONS**

The Inspiration Point site was inspected by Peter Hays with the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety (Division/DRMS) as part of the Division's monitoring inspection program. This was a joint agency inspection requested by Ms. Jessica Lopez Pearce with the Bureau of Land Management (BLM). Mr. Bill Clark with Grand County Department of Road and Bridge and Ms. Pearce were present during the inspection.

The site is approved for a total permit area of 19.90 acres. The site was inactive during the inspection. The BLM permit restricts the seasonal start date to after June 15 of each year. The last date of activity was October 15, 2016 according to the 2017 annual report submitted by the Operator. The site was previously inspected by the Division on October 24, 2012.

An entrance sign was posted and permit boundary markers were observed as required by Rule 3.1.12. The site was well organized and maintained by Grand County Department of Road and Bridge. No problems were noted during the inspection. The disturbed mining area was GPS surveyed by the Division using a Trimble Juno 3B. A map of the GPS survey results are attached. The survey indicated a disturbance area of 9.88 acres.

Since the last inspection, the south mining area was reclaimed by regrading and reseeding the area. The approved Reclamation Plan allows for slopes no greater than 2H:1V. The Division estimated the reclaimed slopes at 2.5H:1V to 3H:1V. The slope was contour graded to match the topography of the surrounding area. The slope was broadcast seeded in the fall of 2016. The grasses were establishing well on the dozer tracked slope. The pit floor contained a large product stockpile in the northern portion of the floor and other smaller stockpiles were observed on the pit floor.

Grand County is working with BLM to permit another mine site north of this pit. Exploration for a new pit will be conducted this year. The County will excavate four (4) test pits with an excavator to evaluate the new area.

The approved post mining land use is recreation. Grand County continues to work with BLM on the final reclamation plan. Topsoil stockpiles were observed along the north and west boundaries. The stockpiles were well vegetated and stable. No annual or noxious weeds were observed during the inspection.
