

#### 1. INSPECTION TOPIC: Toxic Materials

PROBLEM/POSSIBLE VIOLATION: Problem: Improper storage and containment of fuels and/or other hazardous materials was present on site. An unmarked drum containing hydrocarbon has leaked into the soil.

CORRECTIVE ACTIONS: Remove barrel and properly dispose of contaminated soil. Submit photo documentation to the Division to show that this has been done by the corrective action due date.

#### 2. INSPECTION TOPIC: Erosion

PROBLEM/POSSIBLE VIOLATION: Problem: An erosion gully was observed on the east side of the pit. The gully is head-cutting toward the permit boundary. This is a problem at this time for failure to protect the affected land from erosion.

CORRECTIVE ACTIONS: Provide photo documentation to the Division verifying the erosion gully has been repaired, and that the site has been reconstructed and stabilized to prevent erosion damage by the corrective action due date.

### **OBSERVATIONS**

This inspection was conducted as part of the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety's (Division) normal monitoring program. Alonzo Salazar, representing the Operator, was present during this inspection. Photographs are included with this report in order to illustrate some of the conditions observed.

The Garrett Pit is located approximately thirteen miles south of Monte Vista and accessed from CR 9. The site is a 112c operation that includes a total of eighty permitted acres. The Division currently holds a financial warranty amount of \$181,755.00 for this site. The Division has reviewed the reclamation costs, in order to ensure the financial warranty reflects the actual current cost of fulfilling the requirements of the Reclamation Plan, and determined that the current financial warranty amount is adequate.

Adequate mine identification signage was noted on the gate at the entrance to the site.

The affected area was marked by fencing and posts that were clearly visible and adequate to delineate the affected area boundary.

Mining was not occurring during this inspection. A truck scale and front-end loader were located on site. No other processing equipment was noted. Materials stockpiles are located on the pit floor. The pit currently covers approximately 54 acres. The west pit wall has been graded to 3H:1V. Most of the south pit wall is approximately 1H:1V. Approximately 600 feet of the western part of the north pit wall is around 1H:1V. The remainder of the north pit wall is near 3H:1V. The pit is approximately 20 feet deep.

An erosion feature has formed on the east pit wall. The gully is headcutting toward the permit boundary and needs to be repaired. This has been noted as a problem on page one of this report.

An unmarked, plastic 55 gallon drum containing hydrocarbon was noted on the pit floor. The barrel was uncapped and appeared to have been tipped over and leaked at some point. The soil around the barrel was contaminated. This has been noted as a problem on page one of this report.

No problems or violations were noted during this inspection.
