OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted as part of the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety's (Division) normal monitoring program. Jake Wilkinson, representing the Operator, was present during this inspection. Photographs are included with this report in order to illustrate some of the conditions observed.

The Brown Derby Mine is located approximately sixteen miles east of Gunnison, located at 38.541480°, - 106.626470°, and accessed from Road 802. The site is a 110(2) operation that includes 0.5 permitted acres. The Division currently holds a financial warranty amount of \$2,500.00 for this site. The Division has reviewed the reclamation costs, in order to ensure the financial warranty reflects the actual current cost of fulfilling the requirements of the Reclamation Plan, and determined that the current financial warranty amount is adequate.

Adequate mine identification signage was noted inside the mine entrance.

The affected area was marked by posts that were clearly visible and adequate to delineate the affected area boundary.

The site consists of a headwall cut into the west facing slope of the hill, where a grated portal is located. The portal was locked and appeared secure. A flat bench and stockpile area is located just outside the portal.

The site experiences problems with trespassers and vandals. Large boulders have been placed by the operator across the access road in order to prevent unauthorized vehicles from entering the site.

No problems or violations were noted during this inspection.
