OBSERVATIONS

This was a pre-operation inspection. Jake Wilkinson and Dave Woodall, representing the operator, were present during this inspection. Photographs are included with this report in order to illustrate some of the conditions observed.

The Sacramento Access Tunnel is located approximately five miles north of Ohio City and accessed from FR879. The site is a 110(2) operation that includes a total of 5.55 permitted acres. The Division currently holds a financial warranty amount of \$7,600.00 for this site. The application was approved February 10, 2017 with a stipulation that no mining activity would occur until the Division has conducted a site inspection and issued an authorization to proceed. This inspection determined that conditions presented in the application package were accurately portrayed and that the operator is authorized to commence the mining operation.

The operation will take place in an area heavily affected by historical mining. There is an existing portal at the site, the Dunraven Tunnel, and associated waste rock pad. The portal is currently secured by a wooden bulkhead and metal gate. An additional portal and tunnel are proposed to be constructed downhill from the existing portal.

Adequate mine identification signage was noted at the entrance to the site.

The affected area was marked by survey stakes and flagging that was clearly visible and adequate to delineate the affected area boundary.

No problems or violations were noted during this inspection.
