RE: Trapper Mine, C-1981-010 Permit Revision No. 8 (PR-08) Adequacy Review Memo

Rules 2.04.11 and 2.05.6(2) - Section 2.4 and Exhibit E of the permit provides information in compliance with Rules 2.04.11 and 2.05.6(2). Although the baseline study of fish and wildlife and their habitats was conducted when the permit boundary did not include the change in permit area approved under PR-7, the study conducted did include the permit boundary and adjacent areas which did include what is now approved under PR7 as well as the areas of the proposed additional sedimentation ponds. As such, the study complies with the above mentioned applicable Rules.

In addition, Per Rules 2.04.11(4) and 2.05.6(2), an update to T&E species and discussion of potential impacts to current State and Federal Threatened and Endangered plant and animal species lists was included with the RN-6 application in 2013.

The Division has no adequacy concerns regarding the above referenced rules.

Rule 2.05.4(2)(b) - The Division has yet to compile a reclamation cost estimate (RCE) associated with the new sedimentation ponds. This RCE will be completed once all adequacy items that may include any changes to the proposed ponds are addressed.
